Wolds Ward Laceby Update April

There have been thirty recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for March. There were fifteen reported crimes in Laceby village. Of these, the following have occurred.

During the afternoon of 26th March, entry was gained to a home on Grimsby Road Laceby after a window was forced. Following an untidy search, a laptop and games console was stolen.

Front and rear number plates were stolen from a car parked on Grimsby Road overnight 6th & 7th March.

Overnight 24th & 25th March, a vehicle was stolen from outside its home address on Grimsby Road.

Other crime includes:

Two thefts have been reported from the allotments that occurred sometime between October and March.

Five assaults.

Two offences of harassment.

A shop theft from the Co-Op on Caistor Road.

There have been no reports of ASB within Laceby village.
