Wolds Ward Laceby Update June

There have been 48 recorded crimes across the Wolds Ward for May. There were nineteen offences reported crimes in Laceby village. Of these, the following have occurred.

Overnight 25th & 26th May, offenders forced entry to the chip shop on Caistor Road by kicking the door in. Lose change was stolen.

During the late evening of 10th May, a car parked on Cooper Lane was entered. The suspect tried to start the vehicle several times to no avail so left the scene.

Overnight 25th & 26th May, a van parked on Caistor Road was entered. Several tools were stolen.

Other crime include: Ten assaults. Nine of these are from the same household. Four reports of harassment or stalking. One report of minor public order.

There were two reports of ASB within Laceby village. Youths causing a resident on Caistor Road issues banging on the door, and a neighbour dispute.
